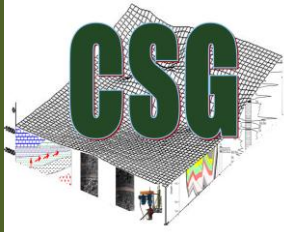

Double the fun with two gas streams

If it's a hot topic in gas, it's being covered by one of the two streams at FutureGAS 2011.

Yesterday began with an address by the newly-appointed Queensland Gas Commissioner Kay Gardiner, who looked at where the Queensland gas market is now, and where it's going.

Dale Weber went on to look at the role of gas in a carbon-constrained economy, followed by Icon Energy Managing Director Ray James, who discussed unconventional resources.

Challenges in coal seam gas (CSG) were covered across both the business and technical streams, which included a presentation on regulatory framework from James Plumb; Janette Moore's consideration of the challenges presented by CSG in gas plant design; and, Queensland Petroleum and Gas Inspectorate's Stephen Matheson's discussion of challenges in regulating the safety of the CSG industry.

Progressing downstream, issues in natural gas transmission and distribution were considered by speakers, including; Bob Teale, who discussed automated welding of large diameter pipelines, Andy Carr, who looked at operating and maintaining distribution networks, and Brendan Dillon, who reviewed the STTM experience to date.

Today's forward focus began with DomGas' Gavin Goh setting the scene, followed by consideration of employment issues by Steve Knott at Amanda Cochrane.

Every speaker has provided an invaluable insight into their particular field. We can't wait to hear what's in store for the industry from the rest of today's speakers!
